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INTRODUCTION

The pandemic exposed

disparities in healthcare for minoritized populations and this issue is further exacerbated by political divide. To add to this, the nation continues to feel the repercussions of racial tension and discrimination from the summer of 2020. In this training participants will learn about the impact of allyship within our community to develop meaningful relationships during these polarizing times.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Participants practicing as licensed counselors, social workers and therapists will receive 4 Continuing Education Hours (CEUs) or .4 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) upon completion of the course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course examines the difference between an ally, bystander, a non-racist and anti-racist. Individuals will learn how to confront acts of discrimination to bridge differences and to become allies within the community. This course will also utilize the inclusive leadership continuum to help develop individuals on their journey to becoming allies.

The workshop will address these issues through a combination of interactive dialogue, focused discussion, applied-practice exercises, and small group work.

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
